

Mass timings are to ensure we can comply with all the guidelines to keep everyone safe. Please know that there is no obligation for people to return to church at this time – the Bishops, and our Cardinal, have repeatedly stressed that the Sunday obligation is suspended until it is safe to return to church in the usual way.

General Information – for all parishioners

We are able to welcome just 65 people per Mass. Individuals will be able to sit three to a bench (with 1.4m between them); families will be able to sit together. The church will be cleaned after each Mass. Again, we are very grateful for volunteers who are assisting with this.

Specific information for those returning to Mass this weekend WELCOME BACK – and please do read all of this very carefully

<u>Before you set out for Mass:</u> If you have any symptoms of Covid-19 – a dry cough, headache, temperature rise, or shortness of breath – you absolutely should not come to Mass. If you are in a group who is "shielding" or have underlying medical conditions, please do not come into the church; we look forward very much to welcoming you when it is fully safe to do so.

You must wear a mask or face covering on entering the church; please bring this with you. You will need to keep wearing it throughout Mass, except in the moment when you receive Holy Communion. You will be required to complete a simple form to support Track and Trace. We are not permitted to open the toilets, due to the cleaning regime that would be needed.

<u>As you enter the church:</u> There is hand sanitiser available to use at the door of the church. There will be stewards who will show you where to sit. We must sit people in a way which is safe and makes best use of the space. Please do not use the kneelers, to preserve the distance from those in front of you, and to aid cleaning between Masses.

After the Lamb of God the Priest will show the host to everyone and say "The Body of Christ" for everyone to respond, "Amen." Holy Communion will then be given and received in silence, and on to the hand of the Communicant, to do all that we can to minimise close contact.

There will be no offertory procession, or collection; there will be the opportunity to give at the end of Mass, with a box at the exit. We also strongly encourage standing orders, please; we are in a very difficult financial situation after 4 months of no offertory collection. We will not be able to sing during Mass, as this can spread the virus, we will, however, have some recorded music.

We realise that these are all very unusual measures – in very unusual times. We fervently hope that as the summer goes on we will be able to gather in a fuller way, but we also know that the virus remains present and contagious and that we must do all we can to preserve health and life.
