#### General information on the return to Mass

Mass timings are to ensure we can comply with all the guidelines to keep everyone safe. <u>Please know that there is no obligation for people to return to</u> <u>church at this time</u> – the Bishops, and our Cardinal, have repeatedly stressed that the Sunday obligation is suspended until it is safe to return to church in the usual way.

We are able to welcome just 65 people per Mass. Individuals will be able to sit three to a bench (with 1.4m between them); families will be able to sit together. The church will be cleaned after each Mass. Again, we are very grateful for volunteers who are assisting with this.

**Before you set out for Mass**: If you have any symptoms of Covid-19 – a dry cough, headache, temperature rise, or shortness of breath – you absolutely should not come to Mass. If you are in a group who is "shielding" or have underlying medical conditions, please do not come into the church; we look forward very much to welcoming you when it is fully safe to do so.

You must wear a mask or face covering on entering the church; please bring this with you. You will need to keep wearing it throughout Mass, except in the moment when you receive Holy Communion. You will be required to complete a simple form to support Track and Trace. We are not permitted to open the toilets, due to the cleaning regime that would be needed. As you enter the church: There is hand sanitiser available to use at the door of the church. There will be stewards who will show you where to sit.

If this is your first time returning to Mass, you are very welcome and more detailed guidelines are available when you arrive at church.
