Sponsored Sleepout – "Sleep out to help out" – to help the homeless & BCYS.

The BCYS are arranging a Diocesan wide sponsored sleepout in aid of charities working to provide for people who are homeless, as well as to raise funds for the BCYS. We will be working with young people (aged 15+) in the parish to encourage great participation in this. Banning Nuclear Weapons. Last Sunday, Peace Sunday, marked a significant moment in the work for peace, as the United Nations treaty banning nuclear weapons came into international law on 21st January. The treaty states that signatories must: "never under any circumstances ... develop, test, produce, manufacture, otherwise acquire, possess or stockpile nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices". However, the UK Government has refused to sign this treaty. Our Bishops and other church and faith leaders have asked them to reconsider this position, and more details about this can be found at <u>https://paxchristi.org.uk/nuclear-ban-treaty-2021/</u> We are a Church that champions life, from conception to natural death: together with climate change, nuclear weapons are currently the biggest single threat to life on our planet. Please take time to learn more about this, and to support the work of Pax Christi. **Church open for Mass.** Under the lockdown guidance, the church (and all places of worship) can remain open for communal worship. There is a fuller statement about this on the parish website; there is much to balance in considering whether it is wise to keep the church open. For now, we remain open for Mass, with the strong encouragement to people to follow the Government guidance and stay at home. We do recognise, though, that especially at a time of grief or turbulence, the church is a sanctuary of hope and peace. We have adopted additional safety measures, including more limited numbers (30-35 at each Mass), pews now spaced at 2metres (the Government guidance for places of worship allows 1metre+ with face coverings, but guidance for all other settings is 2metres, so we are following that). Please see the website for the full range of Covid safety measures, and the latest updates.

We strongly encourage people to use the provision of the Livestream and "Spiritual Communion" at this time. We have prepared a sheet of "tips and hints" to help the experience of watching and praying from home, and this is on the Livestream section of the website.

The 9.30am Mass is Livestreamed via the parish YouTube channel, which is at www.youtube.com/c/romfordrc. The direct link to the Mass is posted on the website each week.

Hearts of Hope - Update: We now have two new hearts on display in the front garden as a sign of hope to all who pass by. There is plenty of room so keep sending them in! In case you missed it, here's what to do: We are asking every child and adult parishioner to design two "hearts of hope." Very simply **cut out a heart – of a reasonable size – and decorate** it with colour and, if you wish, the names of people (individuals or groups of people like nurses, teachers, refuse collectors, supermarket workers, the emergency services ...). **When you have a beautiful "heart of hope" put one in your window, for all passing by to see, and bring the other to the presbytery.** As you put the heart in your window, and bring it to the presbytery, say a pray for those you have named – bring them, in your prayer, to the heart of God.
