Preparing for Holy Week and Easter

From Palm Sunday there will be a booklet to guide you through Holy Week, "in church and at home", with the readings and Order of Service for each of the main liturgies.

This week we hold in prayer all mothers and mother figures. We pray in a particular way for children who grieve the loss of mothers, and mothers who grieve the loss of children. We pray for mothers and children separated from each other, for any reason. We pray tenderly for mothers and grandmothers who could not be visited on Mothers' Day last year, and for whom visits this year will take place in a park, from the end of a driveway, or through a window. We pray for mothers who in addition to everything else have been home-schooling for several months of the last year. In the gentle embrace of Mary, and in the hope of the Resurrection, we pray for more joyful times ahead.

Covid-19 Updates

Arrangements within the church

This weekend we revert to the 1m+ distancing of our pews (they are spaced at 1.25m, as a minimum), with face coverings remaining compulsory for anyone without medical exemption. We ask those with exemption to wear a lanyard, if at all possible, to avoid embarrassment for you or for our Stewards. The church windows will continue to be opened, to assist with ventilation.

All of this is reverting back to the pre-Christmas arrangements; in January we removed pews due to the catastrophic situation in Havering. This was a pastoral response, and in returning to the pre-Christmas arrangements, we remain fully consistent with all the laws and guidance. We also remind you, please, to use sanitizer when entering and exiting the church, not to gather after church, and to follow the advice of our Stewards.

So far, the way that everyone has followed all the Covid-safe arrangements has been a delight – we have, hopefully, just three or four more months – please continue to help everyone to be safe and well. We continue to pray for the nurses, doctors, key workers, essential workers and front-line heroes who are doing so much.

Livestream

The Livestream remains permanently in place, and if you have any Covid symptoms, or are shielding, please do not risk your health or others by coming to Mass. The 9.30am Mass each Sunday is available on www.youtube.com/c/romfordrc, and if 9.30 is not a convenient time the Mass then remains online. The direct link for the most recent Mass is on the parish website. If you subscribe to the channel (which is free) you get a reminder whenever a fresh Mass or service is broadcast.

Sacramental Programmes

We have been in touch with the families of the 29 children awaiting Baptism, as well as with the 19 candidates awaiting Confirmation (from May 2020!). The First Holy Communion programme, with 49 children, begins in late April, and the 2021 Confirmation programme, with 25 candidates, will run from late April to November.

Sponsored Sleepout - "Sleep out to help out" - to help the homeless & BCYS.

The Brentwood Catholic Youth Service (BCYS) Diocesan wide sponsored sleepout in aid of charities working to provide for people who are homeless, as well as to raise funds for the BCYS, takes place from midnight Friday 26th March – 7am Saturday 27th March.

Fr Dominic will be sleeping out, with the deer and the moles at Walsingham House at Abbotswick, from where Mass will be celebrated (11.15pm, on the BCYS YouTube channel) as part of an evening leading into the sleepout, for people to watch from home as they prepare to sleep in their gardens.

Easter Eggs for the Foodbank. In addition to the normal – and wonderful – Foodbank donations of all the essential items, keeping some families going in very tough times, this would also be a moment to consider donating Easter Eggs, as these will form part of special food parcels in the weeks ahead. Every time the church is open for Mass, donations can be left for the foodbank; they can also be brought to the presbytery at any time (but please phone ahead first, to be sure someone is in). All donations are welcome. During this time of Lent why not donate "Forty days of Food for others". Make a list of 40 items – basics, essentials, treats, toiletries – and sort out one item each day, so that you arrive at Mass on Easter Sunday with a wonderful "hamper of hope" to donate to the food bank
