# Each year, on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, the Gospel gives us an image of Christ, the Good Shepherd.

The Good Shepherd seeks us when we are lost, watches over us, leads us and nurtures us. And the Good Shepherd calls us – are we ready to listen to his voice? Today is the **World Day of Prayer for Vocations**. The word vocation comes from the Latin word "vocare" – to call. Our personal vocation is our response to a call from God. Amongst us there are people living their vocation, and those still discerning it. Are you called to married life? To priesthood? To religious life? Or to the single life? Do you ever pray about who and what God is calling you to be? We think too of professions with a vocational element, notably nurses and teachers. If your own vocation is settled, please pray today for those who are still discerning, especially the young people in our parish. And if you are a young adult considering priesthood or the religious life, please know that you are always very welcome to speak with Fr Dominic.

We also hold in prayer the people of India, including relatives of parishioners, as Covid-19 ravages the country. We pray for the people of Myanmar and Nigeria, victims of terrible violence. We pray for those working to bring peace, and hope. Annual Migrants' Mass. In the Year of St Joseph, and in honour of St Joseph the Worker, the London Dioceses of Southwark, Westminster and Brentwood will celebrate the 16th Annual Mass for Migrants on Saturday 1st May 2021 at 11.20am. The Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Paul McAleenan and live-streamed from St William of York Roman Catholic Church, Forest Hill. Although we cannot welcome the faithful in person this year, this lively online service will still celebrate of the significant contribution made by migrants to the life of our Dioceses, especially those who have served as frontline workers throughout the time of the Coronavirus pandemic. ## **Covid-19 Arrangements remain UNCHANGED**

## Arrangements within the church

Our pews are 1m+ distancing (they are spaced at 1.25m, as a minimum). Face coverings remain compulsory for anyone without medical exemption. We ask those with exemption to wear a lanyard, if at all possible, to avoid embarrassment for you or for our Stewards. The church windows will continue to be opened, to assist with ventilation. We remind you, please, to use sanitizer when entering and exiting the church, not to gather after church, and to follow the advice of our Stewards.

So far, the way that everyone has followed all the Covid-safe arrangements has been a delight – we have, hopefully, just three or four more months – please continue to help everyone to be safe and well. We continue to pray for the nurses, doctors, key workers, essential workers and front-line heroes who are doing so much.

### <u>Livestream</u>

The Livestream remains permanently in place, and if you have any Covid symptoms, or are shielding, please do not risk your health or others by coming to Mass. The 9.30am Mass each Sunday is available on <u>www.youtube.com/c/romfordrc</u>, and if 9.30 is not a convenient time the Mass then remains online. The direct link for the most recent Mass is on the parish website. If you **subscribe** to the channel (which is free) you get a reminder whenever a fresh Mass or service is broadcast.

**Foodbank donations.** The foodbank continues to be as busy as ever, and your donations are helping to feed families every week. It should not have to be like this – as we come out of the pandemic there will be fresh campaigns from the Trussell Trust to ensure that families do not need to use foodbanks, and that we can end child poverty. For now, foodbanks are the lifeline for many in our local community. The foodbank are currently in need of Tomato Ketchup, Instant Coffee, Tinned Potatoes/instant Mash, Long Life Fruit Juice, Tinned Fruit/custard/rice Pudding, Biscuits, Tinned Fish, Dried Rice, Toiletries: Toothpaste, Toothbrushes, Shower Gel, Deodorant. **Please also think about items such as nappies and sanitary products.** <u>Thank you</u> for any donations that you make – donations can be left whenever the church is open for Mass, and can also be left at the presbytery (please just ring ahead first to be sure someone is in).

**Caring for Creation – are you interested in protecting and caring for the environment, God's creation?** During this year we will be considering practical ways in which we could make parish life "greener", as the country prepares to host International Environment Conferences with world leaders, in June and November, making commitments which affect us all. **Care for creation is part of our faith** – from the Book of Genesis right through to Pope Francis brilliant letter to the world, "LaudatoSi", we are reminded that we are stewards of God's creation. How we live, the resources we use, and how and where we spend our money, all have environmental impact.

Here's just one practical question: if we were to put cycle racks in front of the church, would people cycle to Mass instead of driving? Would you? Or could you walk to Mass?

Last weekend several people responded to the call to be part of a group considering all this – and working towards becoming a recognized Cafod "LiveSimply" parish.
