This weekend is World Communications Sunday, and Pope Francis' message encourages each of us to develop a "culture of encounter". In other words, when we meet someone else listen with an open heart and respect, ready to learn from them. Instead of just waiting for them to stop talking so that we can give our point of view! In all of our communications — our conversations with family and friends, our emails, our Facebook status updates, Twitter and Instagram posts, TikTok or YouTube videos, what messages are we sending? Are they messages of Christ's love, forgiveness, inclusion, welcome and peace? Or are we stirring up division, taking sides? If someone who was not a Christian was listening to our conversations or reading our social media, would they know that we are Christian? If you are looking for inspiration, have a look at the life of Blessed Carlo Acutis, a modern Saint — so modern that he built his own website. Or consider the life of St Dominic, patron Saint of all who preach God's word.

We hold in prayer the people of India, as Covid deaths pass the horrific figure of 250,000, with no sign of slowing down; we pray for those in Gaza, Palestine and Israel, where lives and hearts are torn apart by war and violence; we pray for nurses – Wednesday was International Nurses Day; we pray for Foster Carers. This fortnight is Foster Care fortnight; fostering can be a lifeline of security, hope, safety and fresh beginnings for children and teenagers; we pray for students, from Year 11, Year 13 and at University, taking exams and assessments in all sorts of combinations, online and in schools and colleges; we pray for parents, grandparents and siblings who feel the stresses of the students, as well as for teachers and all who work in education. May the summer bring fresh rest, relaxation and hope.

On Wednesday evening we had a wonderful meeting with parishioners who have volunteered to be part of the group considering how we ever more carefully listen and respond to the cry of the earth, and the cry of the poorest people in the world.

Some changes that you'll see in the weeks ahead are:

- Where the wonderful "hearts of hope" have been, ever since January, we will now have a heart shaped flowerbed, full of sensory flowers and shrubs, attracting bees and butterflies. Thanks to the cubs and scouts who will be helping to create this in the weeks ahead, together with Jayne, our tremendous gardener.
- We will be buying cycle racks, to encourage more people to cycle to church
- Behind the hoarding, part of the land will be left to become wild, for natural diversity, and behind the presbytery fence, the same will happen in part of the garden. If you want a simple way to do this at home, in a garden or a window box, or to gift a friend some wildflower seeds, have a look at the website www.seedball.co.uk

Plus, one immediate action we can all take is to add to the petition asking that Havering Council recycles glass as part of the kerbside waste collection. Our pews are 1m+ distancing (they are spaced at 1.25m, as a minimum). Face coverings remain compulsory for anyone without medical exemption. We ask those with exemption to wear a lanyard, if at all possible, to avoid embarrassment for you or for our Stewards. The church windows will continue to be opened, to assist with ventilation. We remind you, please, to use sanitizer when entering and exiting the church, not to gather after church, and to follow the advice of our Stewards.

Confirmation – 23rd May 2021. Finally! A group of 19 young people began their Confirmation programme in January 2020. They were due to be Confirmed on Pentecost Sunday 2020, and two attempts to celebrate the Sacrament since then have coincided with national lockdowns. But finally it looks as if we will be able to celebrate with them, next Sunday, Pentecost Sunday 2021. Please do keep them all in your prayers – especially as many of them have exams at this time. If you are one of the group, or a parent, please do check your email to be sure you have the information that you need. Those who have enrolled for the 2021 programme should have received an email and your course will begin on 6th June, heading towards Confirmation on National Youth Sunday, the Feast of Christ the King, 21st November 2021.

Ideally you will be familiar with the programme OBS (Outside Broadcast Studio), or have other very good IT knowledge.
