# Easing out of lockdown, with great care.

Some arrangements for places of worship have changed this week, but with the advice that where the Indian variant of Covid-19 is in the community, we should not change practices. For now, therefore our arrangements remain **unchanged**, with three exceptions:

**Additional weekday Masses.** From the beginning of June Mass will be celebrated on a Thursday at 9am and Friday at 9am, in addition to the Wednesday 12.15 Mass, and weekend Masses.

Funeral congregations can now increase to our Covid-safe maximum, of 85.

We are delighted to be resuming **Baptisms** – between now and September over 50 children will be Baptised at St Edwards! If you had a baby in lockdown, or have a child that is not yet Baptised, please get in touch and we will happily help you. **Thank you** to the catechists who help prepare families for Baptism.

Please see the Parish Website for all our additional Covid-safety measures, including the spacing of pews at 1.25m, the use of sanitizer and face masks, and the ventilation of our church before and during all Masses.

- Where the wonderful "hearts of hope" have been, ever since January, we will now have a heart shaped flowerbed, full of sensory flowers and shrubs, attracting bees and butterflies. ### Livestream

The Livestream remains permanently in place, and if you have any Covid symptoms, or are shielding, please do not risk your health or others by coming to Mass. The 9.30am Mass each Sunday is available on <a href="www.youtube.com/c/romfordrc">www.youtube.com/c/romfordrc</a>, and if 9.30 is not a convenient time the Mass then remains online. The direct link for the most recent Mass is on the parish website. If you subscribe to the channel (which is free) you get a reminder whenever a fresh Mass or service is broadcast.

#### "Lourdes at Your Local"

From **Monday 26th - Friday 30th July** (the usual week of the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes), Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Alan each morning at 11am, with Anointing of the Sick and joyful music, followed by a cup of coffee and refreshments in the parish hall afterwards. The Masses will take place in Leigh-on-Sea, Clacton-on-Sea, Canning Town, Wanstead and Brentwood and everyone is warmly invited. Our nearest Mass is at **Brentwood Cathedral** at 11am on **Friday 30**<sup>th</sup> **July.** 

These will then be streamed online each evening, and there will also be a Daily Rosary, Torchlight Procession and Talent Show available to take part in virtually during the week. Further details and a full itinerary – including "Lourdes on the Lawn" for young adults, aged 18-28, at Walsingham House on Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> July – are available on www.bcys.net/events.

In the month of May we are invited to join with Pope Francis and Marian Shrines throughout the world in praying the Rosary, with a different Shrine leading the prayers each day.
