Today is Trinity Sunday. We believe in one God, in three "persons" of the Trinity -Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is an immense, amazing and profound mystery. God the Father creates and nurtures; God the Son understands what it is to be human, and has walked the journey of life, love, sacrifice, forgiveness, hope, struggle and joy – and then, through death and Resurrection, opened the doors to eternal life for us; God the Holy Spirit animates and infuses us with the Gifts and Fruits that we celebrated last Sunday, Pentecost Sunday. Each of these persons of the Trinity is God. A practical way to begin to understand this is to see it like three wicks in a single candle, or H2O existing as ice, water and steam. But in profound ways it will always be a mystery – a mystery with love at the centre. For it is in love that the Father and Son relate, and with an overflowing of love that the Holy Spirit expresses the very essence of God, as our advocate and accompanier on earth. Rest in the wonder of the Trinity. Rest in the glorious love of God.

We hold in prayer the people of Gaza, Palestine and Israel, praying that the ceasefire will hold, and fresh peace and understanding will be possible. In this week when the anniversary of the death of George Floyd has been commemorated across the world we pray for an ever deeper understanding that every person, in all our diversity, is made in the image and likeness of God. We pray for students who have just completed exams, that these may be weeks of rest, relaxation and hope. We pray for all those who continue to be devastated by Coronavirus, and all who are working to treat those who are ill, to accompany those who grieve, to encourage and support those who remain fearful of venturing into the world, and to rebuild shattered lives and hearts.

Easing out of lockdown, with great care.

Some arrangements for places of worship have changed this week, but with the advice that where the Indian variant of Covid-19 is in the community, we should not change practices. For now, therefore our arrangements remain **unchanged**, with three exceptions:

Additional weekday Masses. From this week Mass will be celebrated on a Thursday at 9am and Friday at 9am, in addition to the Wednesday 12.15 Mass, and weekend Masses. Funeral congregations can now increase to our Covid-safe maximum, of 85.

We are delighted to be resuming **Baptisms** – between now and September over 50 children will be Baptised at St Edwards! If you had a baby in lockdown, or have a child that is not yet Baptised, please get in touch and we will happily help you. **Thank you** to the catechists who help prepare families for Baptism.

Please see the Parish Website for all our additional Covid-safety measures, including the spacing of pews at 1.25m, the use of sanitizer and face masks, and the ventilation of our church before and during all Masses.

<u>Laudato Si – Caring for our common home; listening and responding to</u> <u>"the cry of the earth, the cry of the world's poorest people."</u>

This week's idea, for your home, is an idea as old as the Last Supper, as old as the Passover meal. Say grace before you eat any food, or have a drink. At Mass we are reminded of Jesus giving thanks before blessing the bread and wine. Saying grace reminds us that everything we eat and drink is a gift – God's gift. This changes our relationship with food and drink – try it and see! And it is a great habit for families to get into. Look up simple graces online. To say grace before meals costs nothing and changes everything.

Thanks to the cubs and scouts, as well as our wonderful gardener, Jayne, who have begun to create a heart shaped flowerbed, full of sensory flowers and shrubs, attracting bees and butterflies. There was some very muddy digging in the rain on Monday!

Cycle racks will be installed soon.

The direct link for the most recent Mass is on the parish website. If you **subscribe** to the channel (which is free) you get a reminder whenever a fresh Mass or service is broadcast.

"Lourdes at Your Local"

From **Monday 26th - Friday 30th July** (the usual week of the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes), Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Alan each morning at 11am, with Anointing of the Sick and joyful music, followed by a cup of coffee and refreshments in the parish hall afterwards. The Masses will take place in Leigh-on-Sea, Clacton-on-Sea, Canning Town, Wanstead and Brentwood and everyone is warmly invited. Our nearest Mass is at **Brentwood Cathedral** at 11am on **Friday 30th July**.

These will then be streamed online each evening, and there will also be a Daily Rosary, Torchlight Procession and Talent Show available to take part in virtually during the week.
