Today is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ. The Gospel tells us of the Last Supper, the first Eucharist, and we are reminded that Jesus gave his very self for us, as a definitive act of pure love that opened the pathway to eternal life. At every Mass we re-present the Last Supper. The ordinary gifts of bread and wine are consecrated into the extraordinary gift of Jesus himself.

Sometimes that understanding may leave us thinking we are unworthy of Holy Communion. Pope Francis' very first letter to the world (Encyclical) was called *Evangelii Gaudium* ("The Joy of the Gospel"), and he drew from St Ambrose, writing, "The Eucharist, although it is the fullness of sacramental life, is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak" (EG 47). We all need such nourishment, and it is a grace and gift to be able to receive it at Mass. I am very mindful of those who have shielded for many months, unable to receive Communion, and look forward to welcoming more and more people back, as restrictions ease. In the meantime, how wonderful that 50 children in the parish are preparing to receive Holy Communion for the first time, just three weeks from now. We pray for them, and their families.

We hold in prayer the people of Gaza, Palestine and Israel, praying that the ceasefire will hold, and fresh peace and understanding will be possible. We pray for all those who continue to be devastated by Coronavirus, and all who are working to treat those who are ill, to accompany those who grieve, to encourage and support those who remain fearful of venturing into the world, and to rebuild shattered lives and hearts.

Easing out of lockdown, with great care.

Some arrangements for places of worship have changed, but with the advice that where the Indian variant of Covid-19 is in the community, we should not change practices. For now, therefore our arrangements remain **unchanged**, with three exceptions:

There are now **weekday Masses** on a Thursday at 9am and Friday at 9am, in addition to the Wednesday 12.15 Mass, and weekend Masses.

Funeral congregations can now increase to our Covid-safe maximum, of 85.

We are delighted to have resumed **Baptisms** — with 6 Baptisms on the Bank Holiday weekend, and over 60 children celebrating Baptism in the weeks ahead. If you had a baby in lockdown, or have a child that is not yet Baptised, please get in touch and we will happily help you. **Thank you** to the catechists who help prepare families for Baptism. **Please see the Parish Website for all our additional Covid-safety measures, including the spacing of pews at 1.25m, the use of sanitizer and face masks, and the ventilation of our church before and during all Masses.**

<u>Laudato Si – Caring for our common home; listening and responding to</u> "the cry of the earth, the cry of the world's poorest people."

This idea, for your home, was in last week's newsletter, but we have kept it in as it is perfect for this Corpus Christi weekend; it is as old as the Last Supper, as old as the Passover meal. Say grace before you eat any food, or have a drink. At Mass we are reminded of Jesus giving thanks before blessing the bread and wine. Saying grace reminds us that everything we eat and drink is a gift – God's gift. This changes our relationship with food and drink – try it and see! And it is a great habit for families to get into. Look up simple graces online. To say grace before meals costs nothing and changes everything.

Thanks to the cubs and scouts, as well as our wonderful gardener, Jayne; the heart shaped flowerbed is taking shape, as you can see, and the cubs and scouts will complete some final bee and butterfly friendly planting on Monday!

Cycle racks will be installed soon.

"Lourdes at Your Local"

From **Monday 26th - Friday 30th July** (the usual week of the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes), Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Alan each morning at 11am, with Anointing of the Sick and joyful music, followed by a cup of coffee and refreshments in the parish hall afterwards. The Masses will take place in Leigh-on-Sea, Clacton-on-Sea, Canning Town, Wanstead and Brentwood and everyone is warmly invited. Our nearest Mass is at **Brentwood Cathedral** at 11am on **Friday 30**th **July.**

These will then be streamed online each evening, and there will also be a Daily Rosary, Torchlight Procession and Talent Show available to take part in virtually during the week.
