**This weekend** we focus on a very significant moment in the journey of the Church across the whole world. **Pope Francis invites us** <u>all</u> **to be part of a Synod, beginning now** and concluding in 2023. "What is a Synod?" you may well be asking! It means "Gathering" or "Assembly" and it is a crucial part of **the way the Church deepens and develops ideas** – right from the Council of Jerusalem about 48AD, just a few years after Jesus died, mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles.

This Synod is entitled a **"Synod on Synodality"** but don't give up on it just because of the title! What it means is that this is a serious look about how we listen to and learn from each other, and how we journey together, as Church, and reaching to the margins. Bishop Alan has written to us about this; his words will form part of this week's homily. The "first phase" of the Synod, lasting until the early spring, is all about listening to each other, focused on three areas, each with questions for us, as a parish:

**Communion** ("Journeying together"). In general, how well do we journey together as a parish? During the Pandemic, how well did we keep everything (and everyone) together? What were the strengths, and what did we not do so well?

**Participation.** Who is missing from our church? Why? What could we do to encourage them to be part of the parish community?

**Mission.** How well do we reach into the town we serve? How do we reach those on the edges, the margins? What else could we do?

In the weeks after Christmas we will find ways to discuss these questions together – this weekend is just to begin to get us thinking and praying about it. More info on the Diocesan website: <u>https://www.dioceseofbrentwood.net/synod-2021-2023/</u>
