

Brentwood Cathedral – Lenten Talks

The Cathedral have gathered four speakers with excellent insights into the Synod; the journey of the church over recent years, listening to Catholics from across the world to offer directions for the future, and help us evangelise in our times. These speakers have immense wisdom to offer. **Each talk begins at 7.30pm, in the Cathedral:**

Wednesday 21st **February Fr Timothy Radcliffe, OP**. Fr Tim preached for Pope Francis, lay people, Cardinals and Bishops as they prepared for the Synod.

Wednesday 28th February Fr Jan Nawotnik. Fr Jan is Director of Mission for the Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales, and was present throughout the Synod.

Wednesday 6th March Mr Austen Ivereigh. Austen was part of the team who began *Catholic Voices*; he is a biographer of Pope Francis, and a respected Catholic journalist.

Wednesday 13th March Bishop Nicholas Hudson. Bishop Nicholas is an Auxiliary Bishop of Westminster, and one of the Bishops who represented the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales as a participant at the Synod.

There is no need to register for these talks; just arrive at the Cathedral (28 Ingrave Rd, Brentwood CM15 8AT). Parking is limited, so you may find it easiest to get the train (the Cathedral is a 10 minute walk uphill from Brentwood Station) or bus 498 which is quite direct.

Lent is an ideal moment to celebrate Reconciliation, which offers great joy, liberation, and fresh beginnings. There will be two Reconciliation Services later in Lent – see the newsletter for more details, nearer the time.

In addition, any Saturday evening throughout the year, 5.45pm – 6.15pm, Fr Dominic is available to celebrate Reconciliation.

Please pray for the children preparing to receive Holy Communion for the first time, as they celebrate Reconciliation in a special service on 16th March.

Enjoy a Saturday Lenten Lunch – 12.30pm – 2.00pm

There's a long tradition in the parish of people gathering for lunch in Lent. A simple lunch, with a raffle! The lunch costs £4, and all monies raised will support Médecins Sans Frontières (Doctors without Borders) currently doing life-saving work in Gaza and other war zones across the world (more info at www.msf.org.uk). The weekly raffle will support the Brentwood Catholic Children's Society in their work providing counselling and therapeutic help to children and families across the Diocese. (www.bccs.org.uk)

Stations of the Cross, Fridays at 6.30pm

Gather to pray the Stations of the Cross in the church; a simple reading, reflection and prayer at each station, remembering Jesus' journey to Calvary. The Stations of the Cross are led by different groups in the parish. The Stations reflect the work of those groups, with different reflections each week. How wonderful if everyone from the parish came to at least one of these short services reflecting on the Stations of the Cross! Prayerfully supporting those leading them, and entering more fully into Jesus' final journey before his death.
