After 20 years of dedicated service, Mrs Waterfield will be leaving St Peter's next July, as she retires. More details of a leaving Mass, etc., will come in due course, but for now we thank Mrs Waterfield for the decades of time, care and energy that she has given to St Peter's, particularly in the years when the school doubled in size. Please keep the search for a new Headteacher firmly in your prayers; Governors meet this week to begin to look at advertising and recruiting.

**During the month of November we especially remember those who have died.** On Saturday (Feast of All Souls) there was a beautiful Mass of Remembrance, and in front of the altar there are red candles, blessed during the Mass. These candles typically burn for about a week, and are suitable for taking to the graves and memorials of loved ones. Also in front of the altar is a box where you can place the names of loved ones – they will be prayed for at each Mass in November. There has been the custom of leaving a donation with the names, and you can use an envelope to do that. It is completely optional; all money given will support our work with young people in the parish, including funding for the summer pilgrimage to Lourdes.

**Next Sunday, Remembrance Sunday**, Fr Dominic will join leaders of local churches and faith groups offering prayers by the War Memorial just before 11am. A wreath will be in front of the altar at all Masses, and taken to the War Memorial after the 11.30am Mass. We pray for all who have risked and given their lives for our freedoms, and we pray for peace in our fragmented and troubled world.

There are terrible problems with the proposed **Assisted Dying Bill**, due before Parliament later this month. Effectively legislating for Assisted Suicide, it puts pressure on doctors and nurses, as well as those who are vulnerable and frail. Please write to write to our local MP, asking him to oppose the Bill: <u>andrew.rosindell.mp@parliament.uk</u> – along with other MPs, he will vote on this Bill on 29<sup>th</sup> November, so now is the time to write to him. There is significant opposition to this Bill, which changes how we understand death and dying in ways that have appalling consequences.
