Pope Leo XIV used a memorable and powerful phrase to describe young people when he was talking with teachers earlier this year. He said, "Young people are a volcano of life, energy, feelings and ideas." Yes! A volcano is amazing and unpredictable. It can lie dormant for a very long time before suddenly erupting. The eruption is astonishing in its beauty and vibrance, and while it can be destructive it also has the potential to change landscapes in permanent and wonderful ways, to create new views and new pathways.

All of this applies to the Catholic faith of our young people. We are so blessed with their creative gifts — notably their musical talent — in this parish. We pray that they thrive, and we support them wherever we can so that they do. On this **Feast of Christ the King** we are reminded that the kind of leadership we hope the young people can both offer others, and experience in the adults around them, is the leadership of Christ the Good Shepherd and Servant King. A leadership that meets hatred with love; persecution with forgiveness; despair with hope.

Today is the Feast of Christ the King and World Youth Sunday We especially honour and celebrate the young people of our Church, and a young parishioner will speak at each Mass. There will be a **second collection** to support the work of the **Brentwood Catholic Youth Service**, helping young people grow in faith through retreats, pilgrimages, and leadership opportunities. The money donated in the hall will go to parish youth funds, notably to support young people to travel to Lourdes in the summer to assist the frail and ill.
