**This weekend's readings and Gospel focus us on light, harmony, inclusion, and responding to God's call.** At a time when the world appears ever more fragmented, these themes are so vital. God shines light where there is darkness, offers peace where there is division, and calls us to use our God given talents, graces and strengths for the good of every person.

We might look at the International political situation and wonder, "What can I do?" Part of the answer is always **prayer**; raise the cries of our heart to the Lord, trusting that he hears us. Another part of the answer is **living as God calls us to live**; if we live peacefully in what we say, how we act, and what we write in emails and on Social Media, then we are helping to bring harmony to our corner of Romford. Like water poured on dry soil such **peaceful action** brings fresh life and hope. In the Gospel Jesus goes to Zebulun and Naphtali. This is significant, as he is fulfilling the prophecy we hear in the First Reading. These places are within "the land of the Gentiles" – those who are not Jewish. It is a definitive sign that **Jesus is for all people, at all times**. In the second reading St Paul is very clear that factions and divisions are not from God.

Today is also the **Sunday of the Word of God**. It is a day when we are encouraged to dive ever more deeply into the Bible.
